WEATHER: Highs are around 75 degrees; lows around 52 degrees. There is a high chance of showers during the rainy season (May-October).

tetting to Know Guatemala

TIME: Central Standard Time

CURRENCY: 1 US dollar = 7.75 quetzales

ALTITUDE: Casa Angelina sits in the mountains outside Chimaltenango at over 7,000 ft. elevation. Some people experience shortness of breath, feel dizzy due to lower oxygen concentration, and get sunburns much quicker. It is best to take it a little slower the first day and keep yourself hydrated.

DRESS: Please plan to dress for spring outdoor work: jeans/shorts, work boots or closed-toe shoes, light rain jacket or poncho, work gloves, and a hat. Sweaters are sometimes needed.

AT CASA ANGELINA: Water, tea, and coffee are freely available during your workday. Our gift shop also sells shirts, packaged coffee, and snacks. The shop accepts both dollars and quetzales. Should there be any need for medical attention during your trip, our on-site Mercy Clinic will be open each day.

Planning Your Trip to Casa Angelina

4-6 MONTHS OUT: DATES

Select which team trip you would like to attend (see list of dates on page 2). Contact our US office to notify us of your interest.

1 3 MONTHS OUT: FLIGHTS, TEAM LIST, AND SKILL SET

Book your team members' flights into Guatemala City (GUA). Teams should arrive on the Saturday (or Friday if necessary) before the workweek and leave on the Saturday following the workweek between the hours of 10am - 5pm.

After your flights have been booked, please email your itinerary to our Team Coordinator. Also include a list of team members and their skill sets (carpentry, landscaping, electrical work, etc.). Please inform us of the ages of any children under 18.

2-3 MONTHS OUT: HOTEL

Notify our Team Coordinator of which hotel you would like to stay at (see page 5). Include a detailed rooming list: the type of room (single, double, triple, etc.), how many of each you will need, and the names of the individuals staying in each room. We will make your reservation for you to ensure the special rate. Note: A credit card may be required in order to hold the rooms.

☐ 4 WEEKS OUT: TEAM FEES

Team administration fees (\$250/person) are due to our US office. This fee covers airport pick-up/drop-off, transportation to/from Casa Angelina every day, lunches during the workweek, and essential toiletries and cleaning supplies needed for the team week. Please mail or call in your team payment or submit online at http://whatmattersmm.org/go.

☐ 4 WEEKS OUT: RELEASE FORMS

IMPORTANT NOTE: Team members MUST SUBMIT THEM ONLINE at http://whatmattersmm.org/go or in the footer of our website. Signing the Waiver Form is a prerequisite for coming to Casa Angelina.

1-2 WEEKS OUT: Our Team Coordinator will email a general list of the projects your team will be working on while at Casa Angelina. This email will also include current needs at the orphanage (e.g., supplies, clothes) in case your team is interested in bringing down donations.



Hotel Options

All teams stay in the beautiful city of Antigua about one hour drive from Casa Angelina. We keep our hotel prices up-to-date, but they still may vary; our Team Coordinator will confirm them.

Please remember to confirm your trip at least 2 MONTHS before coming so that our office can make your hotel reservations.

Team Schedule

Friday/Saturday: Arrival

Team flies into Guatemala City and is met by Casa Angelina staff. Team is taken to their hotel in Antigua, approximately a 1-2 hour drive depending on traffic.

Sunday: Free Day

Sightseeing and shopping in Antigua (as desired and organized by your team)

Monday: Orientation Day

 $8:45 \mathrm{am}$ Bus will be at the hotel and ready to leave by $9:00 \mathrm{am}$

10:00am Welcome, orientation, rules, and tour at Casa Angelina

1:00pm Lunch provided at the orphanage

2:00pm Visit the widows in the village

4:00pm Playtime with our children.

5:00pm Bus will leave Casa Angelina to take the team back to the hotel

Tuesday - Friday: Work Days

7:45am Bus will be at the hotel and ready to leave by 8:00am

9:00am Daily devotion and instructions

10:00am Work begins

1:00pm Lunch provided at the orphanage

2:00pm Work resumes

4:00pm Playtime with our children.

5:00pm Bus will leave Casa Angelina to take the team back to the hotel

Saturday: Departure

Bus will pick up the team depending on departure flight time and take the team to the airport. If your team has an early-morning flight on Saturday, contact the Team Coordinator about arranging a Friday night hotel stay in Guatemala City.

Travel Tips

- Notify your bank and/or credit card company of your trip abroad. If bringing US dollars, make sure they are crisp bills without any rips.
- Pack any prescription medications in your carry-on luggage to ensure their arrival in Guatemala.
- Bring snacks (e.g., granola bars) and first aid items (e.g., ibuprofen, diarrhea medicine, muscle ache remedy).
- Use bottled water for drinking and brushing your teeth.
- Eat well-cooked foods and fruits/vegetables that can be peeled.
 Please do not eat street food.
- Leave all costly jewelry or personal items at home. While in the marketplaces, keep your wallet or purse secure.
- We suggest you keep your passport in your hotel safe and carry a photocopy of it with you while in Guatemala.

Build a Widow's Home

If you are interested in sponsoring and building a home for a widow, please communicate with our team coordinator at least 8 weeks prior to your trip. We'll purchase the supplies and have the foundation poured and walls raised by the time your team arrives so that you can finish the house and present it to the widow! Building the home cost USD\$9,000 which also includes furniture, dishes, and bedding for the home!
